



Coming Next Spring: Zip Lining and Hocking Hills

Imagine yourself flying across the forest canopy just like Tarzan flying through the jungle on the vines in the area.

Just a few weeks ago, I had the great pleasure of doing just that, accompanying a small contingent on an excursion to the Hocking Hills Area of southeastern Ohio. The highlight of this trip was zip-lining across the canopy of the surrounding forest. I was so impressed with this foray that I've decided to pursue an event like this for GM Ski Club members.

For those who have been to the Hocking Hills Area, no further explanation is necessary. But for those who have not yet visited the area, you're missing a true paradise on earth. And it's located a mere five hours away.

There are several state parks within a close proximity such that one can visit several, if not all, in a single day. Each state park features its own land formation, be it a cave, a series of waterfalls, some cliffs, or just relaxing pools of water. Each hike is between a mile and two miles of the destination for that park. Each and every one of these parks will remind the visitor of some kind of paradise.



Best of all, all Ohio state and metro parks are free. No park sticker or day permit is required.

As incredible as these places are, these will be simply side shows compared to our main attraction for the weekend, which will be Saturday morning zip-lining across the local forest canopy. In short, this consists of strapping yourself into a harness, attaching yourself to a cable which stretches from one part of the forest to another, and flying across the spans for a distance of 400 - 600 feet.

This early announcement is to create awareness for GMSC Members. More details will follow in coming editions of the newsletter. This will likely prove to be just as popular as the Lake Ann Cross Country trip. As the event grows closer, there will also be mention in the GM Ski Club Update E-newsletter as well.

The Upper Gauley River represents the pinnacle of white water rafting. Continuous. demanding, and requiring strong teamwork, this

river features rapids rated Class III - Class V+. White water rafting enthusiasts from around the world regularly make their way to West Virginia to experience one of the best white water rafting trips in the world. The GM Ski Club is no exception. 10 mighty GM Ski Club adventurers successfully conquered the Upper Gauley and did it in grand style by not flipping once unless it was intentional.


Our chosen outfitter was the North American River Runners (NARR). Trip organizer Cathy Schneidt chose this outfitter after consulting with several experienced river rafters and concluded NARR offered the best package in terms of experienced guides and amenities such as accommodations and meals. Unfortunately, Cathy was injured in an accident

prior to the trip and was unable to participate. We all wish her well in her recovery



The ultimate in white water, this journey features over 40 rapids including five consecutive MONSTER rapids: Insignificant, Pillow Rock, Lost Paddle, Iron Ring, and Sweet's Falls. Navigating the Upper Gauley demands quick response to your Class VI professional guide's commands, hard paddling, and a great deal of physical tenacity. Is it worth it? YOU BET! It is the maximum exhilaration. You can't describe the sensation; you've got to feel it to understand it. After navigating a rapids, it is interesting to look back upstream to see just how far you dropped!

The weekend got off to an early start with several



Saturday was a full day. With an early 6:00 wake up, all ten of us in tow, we sauntered to the restaurant for breakfast. With full bellies, we checked out and donned our wetsuits and were ready to go at the 7:30 start time. In fact, we were ready early and had time for a quick informal chat with our lead guide. He spoke frankly about all the dangers and perils of the Upper Gauley, pointing out that we would be going through over 47 rapids in five hours. Five of these are rated Class V or higher. One of these Class V's alone takes three or four minutes on a good day. The world championships were once held here, and it is not a river for the inexperienced. He offered a lesser trip which he was sure we'd be happy with. He got us looking at one another and thinking about it, but in the end, we voted to go for it. Boy, we were glad we did. The NARR Guides were excellent. They coached each member of the raft on how to do their job, moved people around as they saw fit and, in the end, we ended up working as a great team, and it was a thrilling experience for everyone.

In addition to all the mighty rapids we successfully navigated, the trip included lunch on the river, rapids we could literally swim through, and a 20 foot cliff to jump from. One of the rapids as promised took several minutes to navigate through. Another included a 12 foot drop. This one featured a crowd of some 200 bystanders all shouting orders exactly the opposite of the guides calls in hopes of witnessing a total wipe out. For many rafts they were not disappointed as rafts




and bodies went flying all over the place. But alas, our group gleefully let them down by navigating through without incident save the mighty splashing waves nearly wiped us overboard.

There were many pictures and many memories and enough thrills to last, well, to last at least until the next trip. The package included breakfast Saturday and Sunday, lunch on the river, and dinner Saturday night. The dinner featured BBQ Ribs and chicken. All meals were all you could eat and our group got their money's worth. The accommodations consisted of a bunkhouse. Although rustic, they were new, clean, and comfortable.

All agreed this would be a great trip for repeating next year, so watch for further announcements. If you're a fan of Whitewater Rafting, you don't want to miss the next opportunity to raft the great Upper Gauley.

This event will be limited to the first 40 people, members and non-members, who send in their money.


It is being offered to the membership first. After this special intro it will be offered to non-members at the regular \$18.00 rate.


Movie Night at the Redford Theater



Cancellations:

- 1) If full payment, or written notice of cancellation, is not received by the last payment deadline, then deposit and payments will be forfeited per the schedule below.
- 2) The following schedule details the amount a person may forfeit if they cancel or fail to show on time on the day of the event. Unrecoverable expenses are expenses incurred by the club for transportation, lodging, etc. due to cancellation of the member:
 - a) If more than ninety (90) calendar days prior to the event, he/she is assessed only unrecoverable expenses.
 - b) If less than ninety (90) calendar days prior to the event, he/she is assessed a \$50 cancellation fee plus unrecoverable expenses.
 - c) "No Show" on the day of the event forfeits the total cost of the trip.
 - d) If a canceller finds a substitute for himself, he/she will only be subject to any unrecoverable expenses. The canceller is responsible for collecting all forms and monies for the trip and transferring them to the Trip Leader before the commencement of the trip.

Refunds

- a) A full refund will be made if, for any reason, the trip is canceled by GM Ski Club and/or the Tour Operator.
- b) A refund of the deposit will be made if a member cancels while still wait listed.
- c) Requests for refunds will be processed by the Trip Leader; only after the event is run and all revenues and expenses detailed. The Trip Leader shall provide the respective Trip Chairperson or Activities Chairperson the requests which includes the names, addresses, phone numbers, date of cancellation, and amounts requested within thirty (30) calendar days of completion of the event. At the next Board Meeting, the Treasurer will write refund checks for approved requests
- d) Members may appeal any determination of a refund to the Board of Directors. Any request to deviate from the above policy must be submitted in writing to one of the officers within sixty (60) calendar days of the completion of the event and approved by a majority vote of the Board of Directors.




