From the President By Darrell Ahlberg, President

This will be my last column as President of the GM Ski Club. For personal reasons, I have decided not to seek office for a second term. So I would like to use this column to not only reflect, not only over the past year, but over my tenure as a board member. What it has meant to me personally, but what I hope it will mean to you as the club moves into the future.

I've been a board member of the GM Ski Club for 11 years now, first joining as membership chair in 2001. The first few years were marked by a steadily declining membership as well as a draining treasury. In 2008, with a membership of just 14 members and a treasury barely above water, we faced a crossroads. Times like these offer the greatest opportunity to do something positive and I will always be grateful for that opportunity. It's been a pleasure and a privilege to work with some great people to turn this thing around. We rolled our sleeves and put together a program of activities and other initiatives founded on certain guiding principles:

- Give members a variety of activities to choose from.
- Tap into the talents and tastes of individual members by inviting everyone to get more involved in the club's leadership by offering a wider variety of leadership opportunities.
- Get the treasury back on track. A healthy treasury is required in order to cover administrative costs and to provide initial funding
 of large events and trips.
- Most importantly, we provided "value in membership". Indeed, we took such unprecedented steps like offering members events at below the cost to the club.
- Foster a "community" environment by encouraging everyone to contribute and by recognizing and appreciating the contributions
 of all who help out.

By taking steps like these and offering members discounts on a large number of events, we truly gave people tangible value in joining the club. Soon we had people coming from other walks of life as well as people with long expired memberships rejoining the club. As members began taking charge of more events they began to feel a greater sense of ownership of the club. By February of 2009, we had a special celebration at our general meeting celebrating the signing of member 100. Our treasury is much improved. We transformed the club into a "club by the people, for the people." I.E. we've managed to expand and diversify our offering by encouraging club members to become a part of the organization bring ideas to the table. We implemented special annual Activities planning meeting where we encourage all club members show up with their ideas and help plan the next year's activities. We implemented an annual Activities Appreciation Night. This is a great evening of dinner and camaraderie where the club expresses its appreciation to all individuals who've had a hand in the running of the club, whether through running individual events, serving as board members, or simply helping spread the word about what we're doing.

We also implemented additional value for members who help us spread the word in what we do. Recognizing our members are our greatest ambassadors, we express our appreciation for helping us spread the word by awarding a free year's membership for every three members you recruit.

I remember when our membership meetings were so small, we held our meetings in the middle of a crowded bar because we couldn't find a restaurant that could justify giving us a private room. At our summer picnic meetings at Halmich park in Warren with 10-15 total turnout, the big pavilion was a lonely place. As our new initiatives took hold and our numbers grew month after month, witnessing the growing energy and enthusiasm was truly exhilarating. I will always be grateful for the opportunity to have had a hand in making it all happen.

Although we've come a long way, there is still much that can be done and your help is needed. Implementing all these initiatives required innovative ideas which have worked so well, they are now tradition. So as the torch gets passed, I look for them to continue and to grow. I also look for new technologies, such as social networking to be further exploited as we continue spreading the word about what this great club does. We need new innovations which will also become tradition in time. Don't be afraid to try something new. Along this road to success, many ideas were tried and discarded. You'll never know if an idea will work unless you give it a try.

Lord Baden-Powell, founder of the Scouting movement once said "Try to leave this world a little better than you found it and, when your turn comes to die, you can die happy in feeling that at any rate you have not wasted your time but have done your best."

No, I'm not dying, but I feel good that I've done my best and that I have left the GM Ski Club a better place than I found it. Likewise, I encourage you to challenge yourself in doing your part to make the club just a little better and a little richer than it is now. Every one of you has a special gift you can use. Everyone has that one thing they love so much, they do it better than most people. Ask yourself what can you do, no matter how big or small, to apply your special talents and improve this great club.

Being granted the privilege of serving for a year as your president has been a great honor and a great capstone to a long and rewarding career as a GM Ski Club board member. Thank you for the opportunity and best of luck to all. Viva Las GM Ski Club.



Treasurer's Report - Alan Toomey

Greetings fellow members.

The Treasurer's Report has been published in the newsletter as a bank balance for some time. As a member, and a stakeholder in our treasury balance, you are entitled to know the financial status of the club and I am required in the bylaws to report it to you.

Is the bank account too big? That's a fair question. It depends what you want the club to accomplish. It took us a long time to get where we are. Example, last year we had two large trips run in a close timeframe. We had zero balance for a period. The club made the advance deposits and payments to airlines and travel agents to secure these trips. In effect, \$0 in the bank! The Club was required to pay these deposits so that we could sell these trips to our members. So yes, we have the need for a cash buffer, not a zero cash balance.

I've heard several discussions about this bank balance and felt I should try to put this into perspective. We are currently slightly below par with other clubs of our size running similar activities. Most Clubs are required to file IRS form 990. It's public record and can be looked up. Our financials are also a matter of public record. So if you have a lot of spare time you can research this yourself and find lots of surprises about other clubs and how many different non-profit clubs there are. Our bank balance should be no surprise because you see it every month in the newsletter where we share all important information.
