# Winter Park—My Perspective

Feb. 3. 2007 we sent our representatives of the Midwest small-hill ski idiom on a foray of conquest to the windswept, avalanche prone, 3,000+ footed verticals of Colorado. Veni, vidi, vici. Even with a variety of skiing ability levels and some aches and pains, after about the third day. Winter Park "was ours" and we were saying "where can we go next that we haven't already been." Everybody had probably done all of the good runs, including some of the blue-black and black runs (as long as they didn't have moguls on them).
