Why would I want to be treasurer?

New Ski Resort

What is billed as the first new ski resort in the Canadian Rockies in 25 vears opened December 2000 in British Columbia—and it's a biggie. The Kicking Horse Mountain Resort, in the town of Golden, about a 21/2hour drive from Calgary, has a vertical drop of 4,133 feet, secondhighest Canada (only Whistler/Blackcomb British in Columbia is higher). It's also home to what developers say is Canada's highest restaurant, the Eagle's Eye Mountaintop Restaurant, located at the resort's 7.605-foot summit.


