The people of Spain would often sit outside in the afternoon, sipping wine or sherry, placing small plates on top of their glasses to keep flies out. Tavern owners began putting little treats on these plates to keep people coming back to their taverns. Here at "Sangria" we proudly bring you the bold fresh flavors of the little dishes of Spain.

Dinner Selection -- Paella Valenciana shall be shared by two, and each may select either of the following <u>hot</u> or <u>cold</u> tapas:

Paella Valenciana - Chicken, pork and fresh seasonal vegetables cooked in chicken saffron broth. Paella is a classic Valencian rice dish.

Tapas Frias - "Little dishes of Spain" served chilled.

Ensalada con Pollo y Curri - White chicken meat, celery, onions, and Chilean red grapes in a Curry infused dressing. Served over mixed greens.

Salmon Ahumade - Smoked salmon with capers and dill sauce.

Tortilla de Patatas - Traditional Spanish omelette made of potatoes and onions.

Mejillones en Vinagreta - Mediterranean mussels marinated with Spanish vinaigrette. **Esparragos Allinados** - Fresh asparagus served with onions, red peppers, olive oil and balsamic vinegar.

Esparragos con Jamon - Marinated asparagus wrapped in smoked ham and served over wild mixed greens.

Tapas Calientes - "Little dishes of Spain" served hot:

Mujellones Europeaos - Mussels, garlic, tri-toasted colored peppers sautéed in a creamy white wine sauce.

Brocetas de Pollo - chicken kabob with chorizo sausage.

Chipirones Crujientes - Crispy squid sautéed with spices, multi-color peppers and cilantro.

Pincho de Salomillo - Beef tenderloin brochette marinated in black pepper oil.

Pollo en Champinones Exoticos - Chicken tenders sautéed in olive oil with garlic, wild mushrooms and Madera wine.

Caracoles al Horno - Imported snails backed in a lemon butter compound.

Snowmass Colorado

January 15-22, 2000, Craig S. Petku

Enormous! That's the first word that comes to mind when I think about this trip. This was my first exposure to western skiing and it was a great choice. For those who've never ventured here, Snowmass Village is about one hour drive from Eagle airport in Vail. The scenery is picturesque with the roads winding through what are usually snowcapped mountains. In our case, a unique weather pattern had reduced the snowfall; and most of the non-ski areas were bare, showing their rich red sandstone hues.

The ski area consists of four mountains. Aspen offers double black diamond runs for the most challenging skiing adventures, while Buttermilk Mountain provides runs for the beginner and intermediate. Aspen Highlands is situated in between, offering advanced intermediate level slopes and above. Last and certainly not least is Snowmass Mountain itself. Snowmass offers skiers a plethora of runs ranging from beginner to advanced (single black diamond). Since the weather hadn't cooperated, much of the snow here was man-made, allowing the resort to keep about 75% of their runs open with a 24" base.

One day I ventured out early and tested my skills on fresh powder. Not pretty (I mean my skiing style, the snow was beautiful). I never waited more than a couple of minutes in line and found enough challenging terrain to prevent me from venturing to Aspen except to do some shopping. We enjoyed daily apres ski parties, a picnic on the slopes, banquets; and I even managed to cause a little trouble during an MDSC fashion show (ask Leslie about the meaning of "free").

This was one of the most exciting vacations I've had in a long time and would recommend Snowmass to anyone, regardless of their skiing ability. The MDSC has placed this area on its trip rotation, so look for a repeat trip to this fabulous destination in two to three years.


