LETS GO SKYDIVING

Saturday June 13th - Cost \$145

The GM Ski Club would like to invite you to fall out of a perfectly good airplane. This year tandem jumping is the featured event.

Prior to the jump you will receive 60 to 90 minutes of ground instruction where you will learn the basics about airport safety, exiting the aircraft, flying your body in free fall (just like an airplane), and opening, steering, and landing your parachute. After training, you and your instructor will board the airplane which will ascend to over 13,000 feet above the earth. Once at jump altitude and securely harnessed to each other, you and your instructor will leave the aircraft and freefall to 5,000 feet (approximately 65 seconds from 13,000 feet) at which time you will open your parachute. The next 5-10 minutes will be breathtaking as you float quietly back to earth. All equipment is provided. Plan to spend 4-6 hours at the airport. Bring a picnic lunch, blanket, chairs, and don't forget to invite your friends.

The location will be Napoleon Skydiving Center in Napoleon, MI. About a 90 minute drive west. Video or still pictures (add \$60), or video and still pictures (add \$80) can be purchased at Napoleon the day of the jump. Prices subject to change by the Skydiving Center. 


