



MACC

The main Alpine ski racing program for adults in Michigan is organized by the MACC — a part of the Metro Detroit Ski Council (MDSC). We're a non-profit volunteer organization of adult ski racers.

The Season

Besides awards for each of the 12 races, you accumulate World Cup points over the season. At the end of the year awards are given to the top three finishers in each class and to the teams with the most points in slalom, GS, and overall.

The season ends with a 3-day weekend that includes a banquet on Saturday night where all the season trophies are given out, along with prizes from our sponsors. Sunday is a true elimination-style dual slalom: the Cantor Cup Tournament.

December Ski Clinic

Prior to each race season is the December MDSC/Boyne Instructional Ski Clinic. The instructional is for racers and non-racers, and even has options for cross-country skiing and snowboarding. It includes lift tickets, lodging, instruction, and a party Saturday night. Call 1-800-GO-BOYNE to make reservations.

Race Day Schedule

Races last year were scheduled to start at 10, 12, and 2. The courses are ready at least 20 minutes before the scheduled start time. The start order for each course is printed ahead of time, so you can plan your time. Go ahead and ski until the last minute, socialize at the top, focus on strategy and tactics – it's up to you.

Results for each course are usually posted 20 minutes after the last racer finishes. Awards are given out Saturday afternoon for the current day's races for the Sunday races of the previous weekend.

The Typical Race Weekend

The weekend schedule is simple: register Saturday morning, run in a race on Saturday, run in a race on Sunday, help run one race during the weekend, and check out the awards ceremony Saturday afternoon.

Registration starts at 8:00 on Saturday morning. This is where you check the weekend schedule, check the start order for your Saturday and Sunday races, and sign up for a work assignment.

Running the Races

There are usually 5 or 6 courses set per day. You will race on one of them. At some point during the weekend, you will have to help with one of the other courses. Usually, you will be a gate judge—you stand by the course with a clipboard and write down notes when a racer misses a gate.

Yes, you have to spend about an hour working each race weekend in which you participate. Some good news is that it keeps the cost low—the \$50 registration fee is about as cheap as it can get for a program of this caliber. More good news is that we can actually provide a high-quality race series. It takes a lot of people to pull this off, and we have them! (By the way, we've tried to work the same way as the kid's racing programs and have our parents do all the work, but they just won't go for it...)

Are you an Olympic hopeful, dreaming of winning the gold? Or simply a skier who enjoys a challenge? Either way, there is something for you with MACC

Quality Courses

The race format is FIS slalom and giant slalom. Most races use standard double-pole format. There are also side-by-side dual races and a super-G.

We run with 3 to 6 courses per day, to allow the course crew to set courses appropriate to the ability levels of the different classes.

Race At Your Level

Racers are placed into classes based on ability and sex. Ability groups with lots of racers are further divided by age (vet racers are 40 and over, and super-vet racers are 50 and over). A handicap system makes sure that you are within a few seconds of the other racers in your class.

If you are 23 and raced in high school or college, get ready for Elite-1 or Elite-2. If you are 58 and have never run gates, welcome to class D!

Great Terrain

We run on the Super Bowl slope at Boyne Mountain, with its 500 ft of vertical, permanent shacks at the start and finish, a private parking lot, and a warming hut that overlooks the hill. We also have an extended race weekend at Searchmont, where a true super-G adds to the normal weekend excitement.
